

Suomenlinna Bingo

Suomenlinna is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a residential area with lots to see and experience. Get to know the story of the fortress with this fun Suomenlinna bingo. You can get tips for your visit and for completing the bingo from the tourist information located in the pink Jetty Barracks. Can you complete a row on the bingo card during your visit?



The sea fortress can only be accessed by water. Did you arrive by ferry, waterbus or with your own boat?



The King of Sweden decided to build the fortress 300 years ago. Can you find the symbol of the King, three crowns, from the fortress gateway?



The King's Gate was built to honour the King of Sweden and other visitors of the fortress. Can you find the gate? Can you guess how the gate is closed?



The Governing Body of Suomenlinna takes care of Suomenlinna's parks, walls and buildings. Tractors are used to transport goods and to plough snow.



There are exciting tunnels in the fortress. Take a peek inside the tunnels, but remember to move cautiously in darkness!



The lighthouse beacon in the church tower blinks four times. Ships approaching Helsinki recognise this beacon looming on the horizon from afar.



The fortress walls provide nesting holes for different species. Do you recognise the figure flying in darkness?



Suomenlinna has several cosy cafés and restaurants which offer everything from small delicacies to entire meals. Spot a café!



Did you know that the fortress is home to 800 Helsinki residents? Many residents move around and carry their belongings by bike.



Sailing ships at sea need large anchors. Can you find the old anchor half in the Great Courtyard?



Airplanes used to be built in the Levyhalli hall. Currently, the premises are used to house events. Can you find the Levyhalli hall and the tall chimney?



Suomenlinna has a variety of cannons from the Swedish, Russian and Finnish eras. How many cannons can you find?



Augustin Ehrensvärd, the founder of the fortress, was buried in Suomenlinna. Can you find his grave in the Great Courtyard?
